



RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The fund has deposit with Bank proper amounting to US\$1,338.29 which is 0.40% of the fund. Bank of Commerce is an approved counterparty by the Trust and Investment Committee and the Board of Directors. All related party transactions are conducted on an arm's length basis.

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

The US-China trade debacle and never-ending geopolitical risks remained the highlight not only for the month but also for the whole third quarter. The US Treasury yield curve steepened with increasing expectations of global monetary easing due to lackluster economic data and the persistence of trade fears. With US second-quarter GDP growth down to 2% from 3.1% in the first quarter, a marked slowdown in the manufacturing sector, and low consumer confidence, the US Federal Reserve cut rates by 25 basis points, meeting market expectations. With markets pricing in even more easing before the end of the year, the US 10- year benchmark yield rose 17 bps to close the month at 1.6646%, while the US 3-month benchmark yield fell 17 bps to close the month at 1.8071%. Bond prices dropped by 1 to 2.5 points for the month while spreads closed the month a tad tighter. The funds remain cautiously bullish on rates and keeping the existing portfolio.
